Dear parent / guardian,

I hope that this letter finds you well and that you are starting to enjoy the longer days and slightly brighter evenings.

Frustratingly, we are starting to see some variances in the standards of uniform slipping into school. I have included the body of my communication that I sent to you in September in this letter and ask that you please support The Academy in ensuring that your child/ren are suitably presented for school.

A slip in standards will not be tolerated.

The uniform is simple as detailed below:

Year 7 –white shirt, school tie and blazer with grey school trousers, tailored shorts or new skirt

Year 8 – white shirt, school tie and blazer with grey school trousers, tailored shorts or new skirt

Year 9 - white shirt, school tie and blazer with grey school trousers, tailored shorts or new skirt

Years 10 & 11 – As we continue with the phased introduction of the ‘new uniform’, students in Years 10 & 11 can wear the old or new uniform with grey or black trousers, tailored shorts or new skirt. **(Please note that the only school skirt to be worn is the ‘new skirt’.**

Black school shoes (not trainers) should be worn by all students.

Please note:

Black tube skirts / black skirts / leggings / trainers / hoodies / Stone Island Jumpers / fluffy socks - are not part of the school uniform and should not be worn in school.

In addition, false acrylic nails, false eyelashes, hooped earrings and nose hoops are not allowed. These should not be worn in school for health and safety reasons.

Students are permitted to wear one pair of stud earrings and one discrete nose stud. Hair should be of a natural colour and any makeup should be discrete and natural.

If your son / daughter has an issue with uniform that needs rectifying, please communicate this with their tutor so that support and discretion can be applied.

In the scenario where students are choosing to wear items that are not part of the school uniform, they will be issued with an afterschool detention.

I would like to thank you for your support in encouraging and promoting high standards of uniform and appearance.
